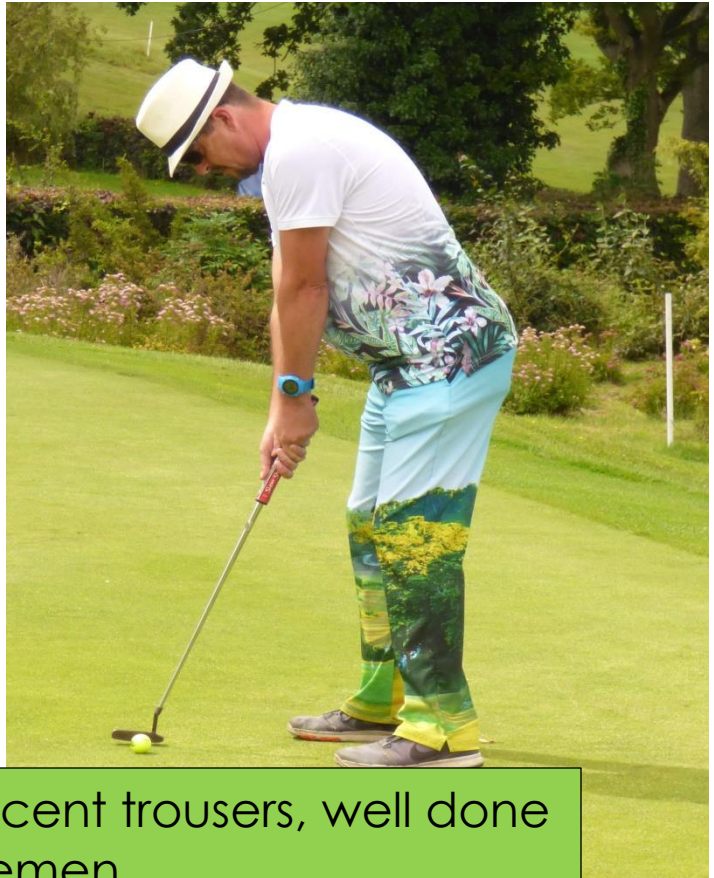


Mr. Williams and Mr. Brunsden both managed to hit the pin on the putting green. Neither holed-out though.
